The story of Joseph is familiar to many of us. We have heard of his amazing technicolor coat and the incredible events of his life. How did the story of Joseph encourage the original hearers, and how does it point us towards Jesus, so that we live differently as a result? Join with us as we work through the final chapters of Genesis, the book of beginnings, to see how God works in broken people.

1. Note how many times in Genesis 39:1-6 we see that God was with Joseph. How does that help you to see that God is working in this situation?
2. Verses 7-12 are a study in contrast. What do you notice about the difference between what Potiphar's wife says and what Joseph says? What determines how Joseph responds to her?
3. Joseph's punishment could have been death. How does God show Joseph grace and mercy in the punishment that Potiphar gives?
4. How has God been gracious to you in situations in which you have been wronged by others?
