The second coming of Christ

1. It will happen immediately after the tribulation (Matthew 24:29).
2. The sign of Christ's return will appear in the sky and then He will come on the clouds with great power and great glory (Matthew 24:30).
3. Christ will be followed by the armies of heaven (Revelation 19:14) and will stand on the Mount of Olives (Zechariah 14:3-5).
4. Unbelievers will mourn for they are not ready (Matthew 24:30).
5. The antichrist and his armies will confront Christ (Revelation 19:19) and Christ will cast the antichrist and the False Prophets into the Lake of Fire (Revelation 19:20).
6. All those who have rejected Christ will be killed (Revelation 19:21).
7. Satan will be cast into the bottomless pit for a period of 1,000 years (Revelation 20:1-3).
8. The Old Testament and Tribulation saints will be resurrected (Matthew 24:31; Revelation 20:4), at which time, Christ will judge the nations and will establish His kingdom.

At Home Study Guide

For the week of March 3, 2019

4. APPLICATION: How does this passage challenge (or confirm) your understanding? How does this passage lead you to trust God and his promises in Jesus?
