# At Home Study Guide

For the week of May 6, 2018

Student Sunday

*Matthew 6:9-13*

*Today our students are leading us in a growing understanding of prayer, through Jesus' teaching on prayer in Matthew 6. They encourage us to pray the Lord's Prayer each day this week and live in light of Jesus. Use these questions to help guide your study and reflection on each verse in this passage.*

*Matthew 6:9:* How is it helpful to you to remember the truth that God is your Father?

*Matthew 6:10:* God the Father is in control, and Jesus' prayer emphasizes that we should pray for His will to be done. Where are you struggling in life between your will and God's will?

*Matthew 6:11:* Jesus' reference to our daily bread refers back to the Israelites and God's provision of manna each day they were in the wilderness. How does that example encourage you as you pray for your daily needs?

*Matthew 6:12:* When has your repentance been empty? How can you practice inward humility, upward thankfulness, and outward forgiveness this week?

*Matthew 6:13:* God, by His Holy Spirit, helps to deliver us from temptation. What promises in the Bible can you trust in for strength in your temptations?
