At Home Study Guide

For the week of August 5, 2018

During June and July we considered the life of David. He was a man who lived his life on mission: loving God, loving others, and serving the world. As we wrap up the series today with a recap, consider how David points us to Jesus, and through Jesus helps us to become people after God's own heart.

Look back through 1 Samuel:16 and 18, and 2 Samuel:6, 7, 9, 11, and 12. Put yourself in the place of an Israelite reading these passages after David died. What would a Jewish person in the Old Testament learn from the life of David?

David was the king of Israel, and a man after God's own heart. But David pointed forward to a greater King, Jesus, the King of Kings. Read especially 2 Sam. 7:1-16 and talk about how Jesus is the fulfillment of the promises made to David.

King David illustrates for us the concept of a king. A king rules. A king leads and is to be followed. A king defeats his enemies. A great king deserves to be praised. How does thinking about Jesus as king help you to understand how to relate to him?
