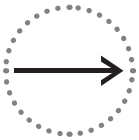
In order to help you mine the precious and magnificent promises in God's Word, we have provided one method of reading the Bible well. This method of Bible reading is often called the Swedish method, a term coined by a missionary who encountered it when she worked with a group of Swedish students. Think about these three symbols each time you read God's Word, and let them help you interact with the Word well.



The light bulb indicates something that shines out for you when you read this passage. What stuck out to you in reading these verses today? If something stuck out to you, note it with a light bulb in your Bible or on a separate page.



The question mark indicates something that was confusing. Did the verses raise any questions as you read? Jot down your question and try to figure out the answer on your own or with some help from a trusted Christian friend at a later time.



The final image is an arrow. The arrow points toward personal application. What is God leading me to know or do from these verses? Jot it down so that you remember later.

The goal is to think about what you are reading as you interact with God's Word in your mind and heart. If God sparks something in your mind, write it down so that you remember it. May God use this method to bless the reading of his Word to you this Christmas!
